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"Harriet Larson Founders Grant" Deadline

Each year, FOML awards up to two \$400 Founders Grants in honor of founding FOML Director <u>Harriet Larson</u>. They are designed to help Friends groups in their efforts to support, enhance and showcase their local library. The criteria:

- a new Friends group is being officially formed
- a Friends group that is being rejuvenated, with a higher priority given to a group with a longer period of inactivity
- an existing Friends group has a proposal for increasing membership, increasing community awareness, or a proposal for a novel approach to advocating for their library in the community

Applications must be postmarked by September 30th and will be considered by the grant committee at the first FOML board meeting following.

FOML Strategic Planning

Every year the FOML Board has dedicated its June meeting to a strategic planning session that provides guidelines for the future development of the organization. This year the board met at Kettering University on June 7th to review and define strategies for achieving the following goals:

- sharing information about Friends and Trustees
- promote and advocate for libraries at the state level
- support and promote continuous learning
- identify and respond to the needs of Friends
- foster FOML membership recruitment and retention and FOML organizational development

The board reaffirmed its commitment to its mission statement to offer support for Michigan Friends and Trustees by providing information through its websites and workshops.

Upcoming organizational changes were discussed, including the change in business and financial services from the Library Network (TLN) to Mideastern Michigan Library Cooperative (MMLC) and the change in office management services from TLN to Island River Digital, effective July 1st.

The most important discussion during the strategic planning session focused on areas where FOML can become more responsive to its membership and provide improved services to members.

FOML Membership Fee Change

Several changes will be taking place in FOML membership services in the months ahead. The first change is paying for membership using the FOML website (www.foml.org) and PayPal. FOML encourages membership renewal using PayPal, since those electronic payments are sent directly to MMLC (our financial services provider) and to Island River Digital (our office manager service). PayPal accepts credit card payments without needing a PayPal account. Payment by check will still be an option. Send check payments to Mideastern Michigan Library Cooperative, 503 S. Saginaw St., Flint, MI 48502.

The second change involves an increase in membership fees, effective December 1, 2017, for the 2018 membership year beginning January 1, 2018. After December 1^{st} the FOML annual individual membership will increase from \$15 to \$20 and the annual group membership will increase from \$40 to \$45.

As a value-added benefit to members, your 2018 membership payment will now include FOML website access to the latest edition of "A Manual for Michigan Friends (A Guide to Creating and Nurturing an Effective Friends of the Library Organization)." Print copies of the manual are no longer available. However, anyone with a paid FOML membership will have access to the 180-page electronic copy.

These changes reflect FOML's continued commitment to its mission as an information resource and support group for all its members.

Cooperatives: Our Continuing Education Mission

Cooperatives have several guiding principles and continuing education is near the top. To help satisfy the need for coverage of issues that concern libraries, the Cooperative Directors Association sponsored a series of webinars that are free and available in a recorded format to anyone who is involved with Michigan libraries – Friends groups and Trustees included. Experts with extensive experience on each topic provide a one hour presentation. The list includes: 1) Human Resources; 2) the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA); 3) Parliamentary Procedure; 4) Records Retention; and 5) Health Insurance. Additionally, the Cooperative Directors Association works with our statewide collaborating partners — Library of Michigan, Midwest Collaborative for Library Services, Michigan Library Association, and Michigan Academic Library Association — to provide information about current topics of importance to libraries. Library safety and security are the cornerstones of providing a good patron experience in our public libraries. Two workshop days are scheduled with different agendas. "Library Security: A Safer Place" is Wednesday, September 6, 2017, and features Dr. Steve Albrecht at the University Center in Gaylord. The next day, "Creating a Culture of Safety and Security in Your Library" is Thursday, September 7, 2017, and will be held at the Dearborn Public Library; again featuring Dr. Albrecht.


