Shelby Area District Library Supports Good Heart Health

The Friends of the Shelby Area District Library are pleased to announce that we were one of the Michigan libraries to receive a grant from the American Heart Association (AHA) to support good heart health! This grant has enabled the Shelby Library to acquire clinically validated blood pressure monitors for on-site use, offer educational support for staff and community members, and provide information for referrals to local healthcare providers. With nearly 120 million Americans experiencing some level of hypertension—often more prevalent in rural areas like ours—blood pressure is the leading cause of preventable death.

The blood pressure monitors are now available at the Shelby Library, along with printed educational materials, instructions to assist patrons in using the devices, and guidance on where to seek further treatment if needed. The Friends of SADL express our gratitude to the AHA for this grant and to the Shelby Library staff for supporting this critical initiative to serve our community.


