Spotlight on Calumet Public Library - Michigan's Northern Gem



The Calumet Public Library is a unique and special library, and the Friends of the Library are proud to be a part of it. The villages of Calumet and Laurium are located in the northern part of Houghton County (often called the Copper Country), across the famous lift bridge and north of Michigan Technological University.

The Calumet Public Library holds the honor of being the northernmost public library in Michigan, 507 miles north of Lansing. We serve the northern half of Houghton County and the entire Keweenaw County. If you include Isle Royale, Keweenaw County is one of the largest counties in Michigan, giving the Calumet Public Library the distinction of having one of the state's largest circulation parameters. Our circulation area includes two National Parks: Isle Royale National Park and the Keweenaw National Historical Park.

In the U.P., we have forests, lakes, streams, waterfalls, historic sites, wildlife, and tourists right in our backyard. Because of the Copper Boom, our population includes a wide spectrum of ethnicities and cultures that have blended over the years to form a strong and proud community that values its library.

However, the characteristic that makes the Calumet Public Library so unique is that it is a combined school and public library. Housed in Calumet High School, the library serves both the student population (1,100 students) and the general public (4,537 library cards issued). Hours of operation extend from the opening of the school day through the evening, providing opportunities for both students and citizens to enjoy the library.



We also offer summer hours so that both students and the public can use the resources any time of the year!

With one full-time librarian and 12-16 paid student helpers, the Calumet Public Library circulates 1,600-2,500 items monthly. Funding sources include generous annual public donations as well as school resources. And, of course, the Friends of the Library provide assistance as well. The Friends' primary focus is on preschool and post-graduates, while the school serves grades K-12. By combining public and school library funds, financial resources can serve both groups. Books, computers, newspapers, tapes, an online card catalog, research materials, a virtual reference library, Michigan eLibrary, Great Lakes Digital, a seed library, a hockey collection, story hour, and the book club are all available for patrons to use.
