

The Novi Library Friends hosted FOML "Talk About Friends" on March 17, 2023. It was very successful and achieved the goal of getting Friends together face-to-face to share and learn. Fifty people attended the half-day session from 24 different libraries. The speaker was Clare Membiela, Library Law Consultant from the Library of Michigan. Clare engaged everyone as she discussed many topics relevant to Friends.

#### They included:

- Benefits of a Memorandum of Understanding between a Library and the Friends
- Conflict of interest when an individual is both on the Library Board and the Friends Board
- Friends groups as a corporation
- Friends groups getting 501 (C) 3 status
- Issues around fundraising

The breakout session following Clare's talk focused on membership. The goal was to meet and get ideas from other libraries, so each table had a mix of people representing both large and small libraries. Some ideas discussed to encourage membership included:

- Early access to book sales
- Free tote with a new membership, bookmarks
- Advertising in community newsletters and flyers in local businesses
- Friends Group on Facebook, Instagram, Snapchat, Twitter,...
- Monthly newsletters highlighting Friends activities
- Passing out membership information at Library events
- Open House, Easter Egg Hunt, Senior Outreach
- Presidential Service Awards

Pat Orr, FOML President, gave a preview of the newly revised FOML Friends Manual. She explained the revision process and showed how to navigate the manual. It will soon be available on the FOML.org under the "Members Login". The password will be sent out to all members.

A second breakout session focused on "How does a friends group define success?". This seems to vary with the size and age of the Friends groups. Established groups have trackable metrics while smaller groups consider success to be raising money when the library has a particular need. A tour of the Novi Library was offered at the end of the morning.

The next FOML Talk About Friends will be held at the Cascade Branch of the Kent District Library on Friday, May 19 at 9 am.










## Meet the Friends of Clarkston Independence District Library



Greetings from Clarkston. The Clarkston Independence District Library (CIDL) Friends are now engaged in preparing for our first bookstall of 2023.

This will take place later in April at the library. Our book sales are a major fundraiser for the Friends group here and we are optimistic for another good year. In addition to book sales we also have fund raising in merchandise available for purchase, lobby book sales and online books for sale through the website Reading Market.

CIDL is a Class 4 library that was founded in 1954. We are in the upper edge of the Detroit metro area located in Oakland County. Although the service population of the library is just under 40,000 persons, the library had over 90,000 visitors and over 240,000 circulations last year and is experiencing large increases in circulation, computer use and patron participation in programs. CIDL was voted the Best Library in area voting for the fourth year in a row.

The Friends have been active in the district library since its beginning in 2012. We have over 250 members. The Friends support the library in their wish list that includes Adult Trivia Night, Summer Reading Program, Read and Steep, Exam Cram, Battle of the Books, Author Visit and Trunk or Treat, etc.. In addition to programs we have also donated book carts, bike racks, a Kaleidoscope sculpture (in partnership with the Clarkston Women's Club), and a Book Nook (reading area) for children.

The Friends publishes a newsletter twice a year to advise members on activities being sponsored by the organization and upcoming events. We invite the community to join the CIDL Friends group.
