Where can we sell all of these books?



[Sharing some event ideas] In October we hosted a Walk-A-Thon. People paid \$23 to walk (or run, bike, or whatever) 23 miles throughout the month- 23 for years we have been in our "new" library. While not book related, we wanted to encourage people to be outdoors and safely interacting before the cold months set in. It also got us featured in the paper's "Outdoor" section and gave us some free publicity because it was a little different.

We are currently doing pre-sales for a Holiday Bag Sale. We are selling 10 books, CDs, or DVDs for \$5. The selections are a mystery to buyers, but they can pick different genres. This allows us to do a sale safely. Volunteers sort and bag observing safe distancing measures, and our library is giving us space to organize while they are doing curbside only with the public. We will be doing curbside pick up to buyers December 5th.
