## Meet the FOML Board Joe David, President of Friends of Cascade Branch of Kent District Library



Joe David has always had a deep respect for the power of the written word. That "calling" led him to graduate from Michigan State University with degrees in pre-law and journalism and a secondary teaching certificate.

After four years in the Navy during the Vietnam War, Joe spent a couple years as a journalist before launching a 40-year career in marketing, sales and management in the insurance industry for companies based in Grand Rapids, MI and Cincinnati, OH.

Playing professional baseball and writing the great American novel were among his earliest dreams. But, they were soon replaced with more practical goals like raising two daughters, trying to hit a golf ball straight and developing marketing campaigns.

It wasn't until his retirement at the end of 2014 that he got the golf ball thing figured out. But, more importantly, it freed him to take a more active interest in the local Cascade library and in the Friends group that had helped make it one of the best branches in the Kent District Library system.

The Cascade Friends have a fine-tuned and multi-faceted process for the sorting and reselling of used books in an eBay store, a physical store in the library, and at four sales events spread throughout the year. Joe got involved supporting this process and was then recruited as Marketing and Membership Chair on the group's board.

As is the case with many things in life, one thing led to another; and, when the long-time president of the board decided it was time to step down, Joe was enlisted to fill her rather large shoes. He is in the sixth and, most likely, final year of his role as president and feels that getting involved with the Friends of Michigan Libraries is a logical next step that will allow him to continue to support the needs of his local library as well as those of other libraries across the state...at a time when that support is more critical than ever.

Joe lives with his wife of 52 years, Linda, on a small lake east of Grand Rapids. When not searching for his golf ball, he does woodworking and tries to keep up with two young grandsons.

He looks forward to working with FOML in its mission to help local Friends groups not only survive but thrive in an evolving world.

### Richland Community Library Murder Mystery Party



On July 22, 2023 Richland Community Library held their first Murder Mystery Party at their library and it went great!

They created the mystery from scratch and called it Murder in the Stacks. They recruited volunteers with community theatre experience to be the suspects and let the attendees play detective and interview all of them. There was a puzzle element for each suspect which made it similar to an escape room.

They had around 30 attendees and hosted it on a Saturday, after close, for about 2 hours. Preevent registration allowed them to have personalized detective badges for all attendees, as well as completion certificates at the end. They offered appetizers and lemonade. Having the entire library free allowed them to use the whole space and spread out the suspects.

They worked so hard on the event that they want to share it with other libraries! If they had to change one thing, they would either have made the program a bit longer (2.5 hours) or reduced the puzzles/suspects to 4 or 5 rather than 6.
